Established by law and appointed by the DC Council, the <u>Bicycle Advisory Council</u> advises the Mayor and city government on bicycling issues. It meets on odd-numbered months virtually from 6 to 8 pm. All meetings are open to the public.

DDOT opposed the passage of No-Turn-on-Red because data show it is unsafe and would confuse drivers from other states which permit right turns on red. The plan for a multimodal city encouraging biking

established a decade ago has increasingly come under fire as road diets and protected bike lanes are installed throughout the city in a radical transformation of traffic. Residents complain about removing traffic lanes, parking, and access to the curb. The new plans cause congestion and and confusion, introducing new hazards for pedestrians, seniors and the disabled. DC Safe Streets Coalition has asked for a pause and a comprehensive review along with new regulations on biking.
